### Personal statement

I am a research fellow in sociology at INRA with a background in agronomy. During my PhD and post-doctoral researches, I have worked on several issues related to the transformations of agriculture such as farm labor issues, land markets, agricultural policies. Since my arrival at INRA, I develop a new research project on the economization of environment in relation to 1) scientific work and to 2) agricultural actors, through sociology of science and economic sociology frames. The aim of this scholarship project is to strengthen the academic rigor of my research working on the relationship between sociology of science and political economy and putting it to the test of a French/American comparative enquiry. On the medium run, I intend to mobilize both theoretical work and empirical information in the making of my Post-doctoral Degree Agreement (Habilitation à Diriger les Recherches). In the long run, my objective is to become a specialist of two crossed-dimensions: 1) the relationship between science and markets; 2) the relationship between agriculture and environment.

I have had a six-month career break in 2015 due to maternity leave.
